We've got an Open Meeting on Wednesday 18th April at the Barn in the Castle Pub. It's from 6-8pm. We need your financial support! Each year we need to raise about £8,000 to cover the cost of the day itself and all the events and publicity in the run-up, as well as admin, website etc. Now the Unions are always brilliant and so far we've received £550 in donations from local branches of Unison, TUC, NUT and PCS. Deanna Allison's filmmaking has also netted us £150 from UEA who are going to use some of her Norwich Pride footage in a movie. We raised £40 from the Football v Homophobia tournament so that means we've got £740 so far - just £7,260 to go! We spread the cost of the Forum hire amongst the stallholders so that's a big help and every penny you spend in the Pride Shop is crucial for helping us keep our central events free and accessible. Kirsty has been filling in various funding applications and has written a brilliant page on our website about how you can raise money for Pride:

This is the first year that Kirsty has joined the Pride Collective but she has always been an inspiration - in the early days of Norwich Pride she organised a Plant Sale and raised £240. I cannot tell you how moved and thrilled we were to know that someone in the community had done something so creative of their own initiative. It was just brilliant, a huge help and a great confidence boost for us. Other sweet funding news - Andrea from the Pride Choir runs Deepdale Backpackers in North Norfolk (<u>www.deepdalebackpackers.co.uk</u>) and she is donating a weekend in a Tipi for this year's raffle. Talking of the choir.....

## Pride Choir

Sing with Pride are now back rehearsing every Thursday from 7-9pm at the United Reformed Church on Princes St. Costs £6/£4 per session. We practice in 8 week blocks and our aim this block is to have as relaxed and fun time as possible. When we start back in May, it will be heads downs working on our performance for Norwich Pride on 28th July. This year we are talking over the bandstand at the Pride Picnic. We've had some fabulous singaround evenings at Jurnets Bar in Wensum Lodge with some wonderful guests like Casper with his Queer Calypso. So we've offered to organise all the entertainment from the bandstand. Talking of Chapelfield Gardens.....

## Sew Gay

Our aim this year is to make Chapelfield Gardens look absolutely gorgeous for the Pride Picnic and the Sew Gay group are working hard making bunting and knitted chains - 75 year old volunteer Margaret has been scouring charity shops for rainbow-coloured wool and must have knitted a mile of chains already! The Sew Gay group have got their next monthly meeting this Saturday 31st March, 12-2pm on the big table on the first floor in the library. They've invested in a portable, battery-operated sewing machine so people can make bunting at the sessions and we seem to be a magnet for young people hanging out at the Forum who have been joining us to cut out

material, learn to knit and design panels for the Pride Patchwork. This is Sew Gay's big project - over the next two years they hope to create a patchwork quilt representing over 50 years of LGBT history, with the panels showing a key event each year.
